

SECTION 28 – CLOVERBUDS

Project Records are required for Youth Building entries.

A Cloverbud Project Record, plus an Exhibit Tag, must accompany each exhibit entered in the Youth Building. Copies of the Cloverbud Project Record and Exhibit Tag can be obtained by contacting Cornell Cooperative Extension or by picking up copies at the Hamden office.

GENERAL GUIDELINES

4-H Cloverbuds must be actively enrolled with the Extension (4-H) office.

Cloverbuds are allowed to participate in the following animal classes: poultry, rabbit, caviar, ducks, turkeys and geese. Cloverbuds will compete and be awarded premiums and ribbons and will follow the same rules as a regular 4-H member.

4-H Cloverbuds ages 5, 6 and 7 will be allowed to participate in designated Cloverbud classes in the goat, sheep, swine and horse sections.

Cloverbuds will receive an incentive award and will receive a Cloverbud rosette. Participants will not be placed. This is a participation class, not a competition class.

Cloverbuds must show young animals. Animal should be born after February 1st and the Cloverbud must have worked with the animal from February up until fair time. The Cloverbud must be able to control the animal. Halter and leadline are recommended where appropriate.

Older members or adults helping in the ring is acceptable.

Cloverbud members may participate in the club booth, club parade, and public presentations (if the Cloverbud did one in February).

4-H Cloverbud members, ages 5 to 8, are invited to exhibit 5 entries in the Youth Building (in addition to animal classes and a public presentation). Appropriate projects include foods, clothing, art objects, crafts, photography, scrapbooks, woodworking, natural resources, vegetables, and flowers.

Cloverbuds will receive an incentive award and will receive a Cloverbud rosette. Participants will not be placed. This is a participation class, not a competition class.
